Proverbs 11:22 As a jewel of gold in a swine's snout, so is a beautiful woman [handsome man] who is without discretion. [George Holder translation] Gold rings hung in the cartilage of the nose, or the left nostril, were favorite ornaments of eastern women, Pr 11:22; Eze 16:12.

Rings were inserted in the noses of animals, to guide and control them; and according to the recently discovered tablets at Nineveh, captives among the Assyrians were sometimes treated in the same way,

2Ki 19:28; Eze 38:4.
